

Program delivery

The academy will generally conduct classes from 5 pm to 7 pm in 2018. Students will have a two-hour session of on-site instruction each week during teaching weeks and will have two hours of programmed off-site work per week.

Teaching spaces are hired as required. Venues are designated as teaching centres of the academy.

Students are provided with a semester unit outline, a term-by-term overview and a weekly module that outlines the week's learning goals, learning resources, activities to do on-site and activities to do off-site.

The Canberra Academy of Languages maintains regular communication with day schools.

In the longer term, we will explore the possibility of offering fully online programs along the lines of those in some other jurisdictions, to accommodate the needs of students following the ACT curriculum who are out of commuting reach of the teaching centres.
